# **AEROSPACE EDUCATION**

Cadets gain an understanding of the complex forces that cause an aircraft to achieve lift, as well as navigation, engines and aerospace history.

In 2007, cadets built and flew model rockets in association with a local

model rocketry club. Their classes were under the supervision of Lt. Cols. Steve Waite and Jo Stys and Mrs. Elizabeth Zoellner.

The AE Weekend, held each September at Oshkosh's EAA facility, provides cadets the opportunity to learn more about the fundamentals of flight, weather and aircraft safety. Cadets built and competed in model aircraft building and other hands-on aviation-related activities, orientation flights and a tour of the EAA Museum. This year, Cadets Niko Ruud, Benjamin Unger, Chad Nowak, David Ushakow, Morgan Murphy, Eric Martin and Dominic DiSalvo attended. Adults included Maj. Sorenson, Lt. Col. Sims, Lts. At its December 19<sup>th</sup> meeting Squadron 5 cadets toured the EAA museum at Racine's Batten Airport and the fixed based operator facility.

#### **Cadet Competition**

#### **Summer Encampment**

During a week-long encampment at Volk Field ANG Base, Camp Douglas, our cadets are exposed to Air Force values and traditions. First year cadets develop teamwork and self confidence in what is for many their first experience away from home. Cadets returning for a second year, enroll in the Wisconsin Cadet Academy, an opportunity to hone leadership skills.



Advanced cadets apply these leadership skills while serving in positions of responsibility. Trained adult members supervise and mentor the cadets. # EMERGENCY SERVICES

Squadron #5's cadets receive training in disaster relief and first aid techniques.

Our Cadet and adult volunteers participated in practice and actual search and rescue and humanitarian missions in 2007. They worked as radio operators, ground team members and mission staff assistants.

Squadron 5 Cadets also assisted in two local missions in 2007:

On April 16, they responded to an ELT

(Emergency Locator Transmitter) call and within a response time of 30 minutes, found the violating twin Beechcraft at Waukesha's airport.

On September 20-21, they conducted a search for a missing man in Walworth County. Squadron 5's senior officers searched for a downed aircraft near West Bend on August 10<sup>th</sup>.

# **PROGRAM SUPPORT**

Squadron 5's many and varied activities would not be possible without the support of its adult leaders (senior officers). Their guidance, training and participation make the Cadet Program possible.

Outreach was performed May 18th, when Cadets and Seniors presented CAP during South Milwaukee School's "High Interest Day."

Maintaining a level of activity takes money. In 2007, Cadet and Senior fundraising efforts included selling Boston Store coupon books (January – March, October - December), selling Racine Kringles, cookie dough and pizzas (April – May), providing 1<sup>st</sup> Aid and traffic control at Dan Jansen Fest (May), at South Shore Frolics and St. Veronica's Music Festival (July).
