




Cadet Program

Emergency Services


Once a member has attained their General ES rating, they're encouraged to participate in Squadron, Group and Wing ES activities to advance their skills. ES classes are part of each quarter's training. Our unit trained in search and rescue techniques during Winter Survival Weekend on 8-9 March, the Wing Evaluated Mission on 2 May; the Southeast Group Practice Mission on 8 August, the Squadron ES Training Weekend on 18-20 September and Southern Wis. Practice Mission on 19 December. Completing requirements for Ground Team 1, 2, and 3 ratings, members worked as radio operators, ground team members and staff assistants.





Aerospace Education

Our members gained an understanding of the complex forces that cause an aircraft to achieve lift, as well as navigation, engines, aerospace history and industry. In 2015, members enjoyed a field trip to the Museum of the U.S. Air Force. Flights are a regular part of the Cadet Program and are designed to give relatable experience to the cadet in the cockpit. Our cadets flew orientation flights in CAP aircraft at summer encampment, Aerospace Education Weekend, and our Orientation Flight Day. Participation in the STEM program enhances the cadets' learning. Our cadets recently started on the robotics module.

On April 6th-7th, fourteen cadets and four seniors from our unit toured the National Museum of the U.S. Air Force, including the Presidential and Research & Development galleries.
